

Welcome to Tennant Trailhead Park

This unique 32-acre park is part of a greenbelt that connects to more than 100,000 acres of public lands within the Mountains to Sound Greenway National Heritage Area.

In 2016, the City of North Bend, Si View Metropolitan Park District, King County Parks, and the Trust for Public Lands acquired this property with funding support from a Conservation Futures Grant and the Washington State Recreation and Conservation Office administered Land and Water Conservation Fund grant program.

Interpretive signage and Lushootseed trail names were created in collaboration with the Snoqualmie Tribe. Trail design and construction was performed by the Evergreen Mountain Bike Alliance.

This park is preserved in perpetuity to provide conservation, recreation, and education for all to enjoy. Connect, explore, learn, and take care of this land, the park, the trails, and the animals and species who live here and call this beautiful place home.
